SUMMARY OF POSITION

This position is responsible for the semi-skilled and skilled operation, maintenance, repair, installation, and extension of the wastewater collection system and reclaimed water distribution systems and their components. The incumbent is also responsible for the operation of the highly specialized equipment used in the operation and maintenance of the collection system and reclaimed water distribution system. Work is performed under the direction of the Collection System Operations Manager and Collection System Lead Operator(s) but exercises independent judgement in accomplishing the work. This is a District safety-sensitive position in accordance with Arizona law and a DOT safety-sensitive position.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Performs duties and responsibilities commensurate with assigned department which may include, but are not limited to, any combination of the following:

- Safely and skillfully operates specialized equipment including vacuum tanker truck, cranes, excavator, combination sewer cleaner, or CCTV inspection truck, or for maintaining, inspecting, repairing, and constructing the wastewater collection and reclaimed water distribution systems and its components.
- Performs and/or leads a crew in tasks related to the maintenance of the District's collection system, such as cleaning sewer lines, manholes, pump station wet wells, flushing trouble spots, CCTV inspection for identifying defects, inflow, and infiltration, etc.
- Performs construction, maintenance and repairs on collection system and reclaimed water distribution lines, sewer lines, laterals, wet wells, manholes, valves, pumps, motors, and related wastewater equipment.
- Performs required maintenance to specialized equipment in accordance with O&M Manuals and policies of the District.
- Required to keep inventory and organize spare parts, tools, and equipment required for maintaining Collection System.
- Performs utility locating using electronic locating equipment, atlas drawings, and GIS for locating and marking district utilities.
- Prepares daily reports for sewer cleaning, CCTV inspection, equipment deficiencies, and construction activities.
- Responds to Pump Station alarms through the Districts SCADA system.
- May need to respond to emergency or abnormal facility situations outside of normal work shifts.
- Performs proper set up of traffic control in accordance with Maricopa County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) and local traffic laws.
- Performs proper set up and use of all safety equipment, such as trench shoring and confined space monitors, for a safe work environment protecting themselves and co-workers.
- Assists in training new Collection System Operators.
- Utilizes and maintains various types of air monitoring equipment.
- Initiates requisitions for tools, materials, equipment, and services.
- Required to be on a scheduled on-call rotation and carry a District phone and/or laptop to respond to after-hours emergencies and callouts.

- Drives District vehicles in accordance with District policy as needed.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Knowledge of policies and procedures of the District.
- Knowledge of methods, techniques and materials used to install, maintain, and repair the District facilities, sewer collections system and reclaimed water distribution systems.
- Knowledge of materials used in system repair and construction.
- Knowledge of construction safety requirements such as confined space entry, trench and excavation safety.
- Knowledge of underground utility locating requirements for proper utility locating and calling in utility locate requests prior to excavation.
- Proficiency in NASSCO (National Association of Sewer Service Companies) Pipeline Certification and Assessment Program (PACP) and (Manhole Assessment Certification Program) MACP standards.
- Knowledge of Maricopa county and local traffic laws, ordinances, and rules involved in safe equipment operation.
- Skill in the use of a variety of hand, power tools and related equipment, in addition to properly caring for tools, materials, supplies and similar equipment.
- Competent in pump station operations and maintenance as well as troubleshooting electrical and mechanical issues.
- Understand and follow oral and written instructions in the English language.
- Complete required OSHA and other safety training classes.
- Basic knowledge of software programs and applications including Microsoft Office products and web-based programs, such as Utilisphere, SCADA and others related to the field of work.
- Ability to work cooperatively and professionally with all other District employees, vendors, and the public.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND PHYSICAL DEMANDS

- Most work is performed in a field setting, with occasional work done in an office environment.
- Ability to work in a variety of extreme weather conditions and exposure to the elements.
- Ability to work in small, cramped spaces and comply with confined space entry procedures.
- Ability to lift and move heavy objects short distances (30 pounds unassisted and up to 100 pounds assisted).
- Ability to support 50 pounds overhead.
- Ability to climb ladders to enter or exit manholes, vaults, and wet wells.
- Ability to safely drive District vehicles and operate equipment such as fork trucks, front end loaders/backhoes and aerial lift equipment.
- Ability to use common hand tools and equipment for operation and maintenance tasks such as: hammers, power drills, screwdrivers, power saws, pressure washers, etc.
- Ability to wear protective equipment as required, such as a respirator, hard hats, safety-rated steel-toed boots, and retrieval harness.
- Ability to work with raw sewage and chemicals using safe practices including the proper and safe usage of all District equipment, proper usage of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), and maintaining a safe personal and common workspace.

- Sufficient body flexibility, mobility, stamina, and balance to perform operation and maintenance tasks which require moderate, though not constant physical effort, typically involving some combination of climbing, balancing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, climbing stairs and ladders, lifting, carrying, pushing and/or pulling of objects and materials of moderate to heavy weight, walking over uneven terrain.
- Visual and muscular dexterity to operate a motor vehicle, equipment, hand tools and computer.
- Sufficient clarity of hearing, with or without reasonable accommodation, which permits the employee to discern verbal instructions, communicate with other employees and the public, and discern warning or emergency alarms, including vehicle back-up warnings.
- Sufficient visual acuity, with or without reasonable accommodation, which permits the employee to comprehend written work instructions and work orders, technical and operational documents, discern color-coded equipment indicators, and move over rough or unfamiliar terrain.
- Ability to wear respirator in accordance with OSHA requirements.

REQUIRED CREDENTIALS, EDUCATION AND WORK EXPERIENCE

- High school diploma or GED equivalent.
- Must possess and maintain a Wastewater Collections Operator Certification from the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality.
- Must possess and maintain an Arizona Class "B" Commercial Driver's License with tanker endorsement.
- Preferred: NASSCO PACP and MACP Certification

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- This is a safety sensitive position that must pass a post offer/pre-employment drug screening, background check and physical.
- This position is subject to random drug and alcohol testing throughout the period of employment in accordance with the District's Drug-Free Workplace Policy.
- This position requires the use of District vehicles for business. A valid, unrestricted driver's license with no major citations within the past 39 months prior to the start date is required.
